DEFINITIONS

TRADITION (N)

A long-established or inherited way of thinking or acting; a continung pattern of culture beliefs or practices.

TRADITIONALISM (N)

Adhearance to tradition as authority, especially in matters of religion.

THAN TRANSFORMATION


Jesus just healed the sick and fed 5000+ but they were worried about handwashing!

They were afraid of Jesus' authority and wanted to make him violate the Mosaic Law

They exploited the people and the word for their own gain.

TRADITIONALISM (N)


Adhearance to tradition as authority, especially in matters of religion.




EVOLVING TRADITIONS: LOVE-FEAST








WHAT WILL GENERAL CONFERENCE 2021 LOOK LIKE?
